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Developing and promoting entrepreneurial skills and competences have been a top priority for the EU and Member States for many years. Both the Entrepreneurship 2020 Action Plan (2013) and the Rethinking Education Communication (2013) focus on a practical entrepreneurial experience before leaving compulsory education. However, different findings show that participation in practical entrepreneurial learning at school is low and that more needs to be done to develop the entrepreneurial skills of young people.
