# **Innovative Tools For the Classroom**

'Learning business by doing business' is a key concept in all JA programmes. Entrepreneurial activities, challenging tasks and game dynamics provide valuable means to stir students' creativity and ambitions, especially in vocational education (VET) where practical application of knowledge and skills proves to play a crucial role. # **Teacherpreneur**

The workshop is a LAB to "learn and practice" entrepreneurship education by using a concept developed by JA Italy and its network of teachers. # Didactic Principles for Teaching Entrepreneurship

Participants will learn about didactic principles, designed to develop students' entrepreneurial competences and personal resources. By using the Progression Model and the Taxonomy of Entrepreneurial Education and Didactic Principles developed by the Danish Foundation for Entrepreneurship, 4 main dimensions will be explored: action, creativity, outward orientation and personal attitude. During the workshop participants will learn how entrepreneurial competences are acquired within these dimensions depending on the level of education.

# **New Methods and Tools to Improve Teaching Profession**
